August 22, 2012 @ 8:30PM Location: Town Hall, Cairo

Reason/Proposal: Michael Esslie, Attorney at Law, representing Meadowfields Apts, LLC(Vasileios Paganos) requested on 7/20/12 a variance pursuant to Section 8 of the Town of Cairo Local Law #2 of 2012-Imposing a Six Month Moratorium on Approvals Involving Resorts adopted 6/27/12 & filed 7/6/12.

Local Law #2 2012 Section 8. Variances

Should any owner of property affected by this Local Law suffer an unnecessary hardship in the way of carrying out the strict letter of this Local Law, then the owner of said property may apply to the Town Board of the Town of Cairo in writing for a variance from the strict compliance with this Local Law upon the submission of proof of such necessary hardship. For the purpose of this Local Law, unnecessary hardship shall not be mere delay in being permitted to make application or waiting for a decision on the application for a subdivision, variance, special use permit, site plan, site plan review, building permits, other municipal approvals or permits during the period the moratorium imposed by this Local Law.

Procedure. Upon submission of a written application to the Town Clerk by the property owner seeking a variance of this Local Law, the Town Board of the Town of Cairo shall, within sixty(60) days of the receipt of such application, schedule a public hearing on said application upon five (5) days written in the official newspaper of the Town. At said Public Hearing, the property owner and any other parties wishing to present evidence with regard to the application shall have opportunity to be heard, and the Town Board shall, within (30) days of the close of the Public Hearing, render its decision in writing, either granting or denying the application for a variance from the strict requirements of the this Local Law. In the event that the Town Board determines that the property owner shall suffer an unnecessary hardship, the applicant shall then be referred to the Town Board, Planning Board, Building Inspector and/or Code Enforcement Officer for a full review of the proposed project in accordance with the then enacted subdivision, site plan review, building permits or other municipal approvals laws, rules and regulations in the Town of Cairo and the State of New York.

Town Clerk: Notice of Hearing

Supervisor: Review of Public Hearing Procedure:

- Speakers must raise their hand, be called upon by the Supervisor to speak, identify themselves-stating full name, direct their comments to the Town Board, and state clearly & briefly why they are in favor or against the proposal.
- Speakers may not speak a second time until all those who wish to speak have spoken once. Speakers may be held to a 5 minute time frame.
- The Town Board may choose to listen and not comment.

Town of Cairo Town Board Meeting @7pm Location: Town Hall Meeting Room

July 25, 2012

The Town Board of the Town of Cairo met for a Town Board meeting on Wednesday, July 25, 2012 at the Town Hall, Main Street, Cairo, New York.

Supervisor Ted Banta, called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM and then asked the attendees to Pledge Allegiance to the Flag. All Board Members were present.

The minutes from the July 11, 2012 Workshop was accepted by Councilperson Ostrander and seconded by Councilperson Joyce.

Assessor Janice Hull gave report on assessment and equalization rate. The Town of Cairo is at 70 percent of market value. She reported if all towns were at 100 percent, we would not need equalization rate.

Ambulance Administrator Reay Mahler asked Board if something could be done about the septic tank collapsing at Ambulance Building.

Councilperson Joyce remarked about foreclosed property on corner of 23B and Route 23.

August 8, 2012

The Town Board of the Town of Cairo met for a work session meeting on Wednesday, August 8, 2012 at the Town Hall, Main Street, Cairo, New York.

Supervisor Ted Banta called the meeting to order at 4:00 PM and then asked the attendees to Pledge Allegiance to the Flag with all Board members present.

Supervisor Banta opened the four bids for the purchase of two F550's and one F350. All bids attached a non-collusion form signed and dated. The following bids are as follows:

Alan Tavenner from Delaware Engineering updated the Town Board on the current Sewer District. Brief discussion followed. Alan Tavenner and Joe Myers will work together to prepare a bid package for the pumping of 125 septic tanks. Highway Superintendent will work with sewer department to have tanks opened and closed in conjunction with the pumping of tanks.

Resolution No. 192 – 12 "Pumping of Septic Tanks Out To Bid"

Councilperson Puorro offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of The Town of Cairo authorizes Alan Tavenner and Joe Myers to create spec sheets and to put out to bid the pumping of 125 septic tanks.

The necessity of monitoring and controlling Clothing Bins within the Town of Cairo arose. The Town Board feels it is a collection area for littering and needs to be cleaned up. Town

Attorney, Tal Rappleyea will draft a local law regarding the placement of clothing bins within the Town of Cairo.

Alan Tavenner mentioned that he spoke to DOT regarding the installation of guide rail around the pump house. Highway Superintendent, Robert Hempstead stated that he spoke to DOT as well and that the Town of Cairo will install the guide rail according to DOT specs.

Supervisor Banta stated that the town received a letter from Attorney Michael Esslie requesting a public hearing for a variance on Local Law #2 of 2012 "Imposing a Temporary Six Month Moratorium on Approvals Involving Resorts". After brief discussion, it was decided that the public hearing will be held on August 22, 2012 at 8:30pm. The Town Clerk will submit the legal in the paper.

Supervisor Banta stated that each department's budget requests are due back by August 17, 2012 and that the board needed to start scheduling budget work sessions. It was decided that the first budget session will be August 27, 2012 at 4:30pm at the Town Hall.

The discussion of the enforcing of the 911 sign law arose. It was decided that the police department will do an inventory during their patrolling of the town and will report back to the board.

Town Attorney, Tal Rappleyea stated that he spoke with DEC regarding the order on consent involving the bulk storage tanks.

- 4. I have been out evaluating roads in preparation for the bidding of a paving company.
- 5. The mower has almost completed its third course around town for the season.
- 6. Hudson Correctional were in the park for a week. They starting painting the pavilion and the parks, buildings and grounds crew will finish.
- 7. The mechanics are working on the snow removal equipment in preparation for winter.
- 8. The men are hauling and mixing salt and sand as work load permits in the preparation of winter.
- 9. We repaired the air conditioner system at the annex. We are in the process of creating a maintenance schedule for all buildings so we become pro-active in the upkeep of the buildings.
- 10. We are reviewing and comparing the truck bids. With such large purchases, fiscal responsibility is imperative.
- 11. We are meeting with an engineer for the two large projects from Hurricane Irene on Thursday.
- 12. We assisted the water and sewer department with shut off repairs and seasonal water turn ons.
- 13. The road crews have been changing pipes in preparation of the resurfacing of various roads.
- 14. The culvert maintenance program is ongoing.
- 15. Town wide trash clean up and the repairing/replacing of warning signs is ongoing.
- 16. Assisted with the Greene County Youth Fair.
- 17. The fountain was cleaned, drained, and replaced electrical outlets.
- 18. Replaced mounting board, installed ground and replaced other outlets in park to meet NYS electrical code.
- 19. We've had a few workers through community service clean up Main Street and the park.

AGREEMENT FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF HIGHWAY MONEYS Section 284 OF THE HIGHWAY LAW

AGREEMENT between the Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Cairo, of Greene County, State of New York and the undersigned members of the Town Board.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 284 of the Highway Law, we agree that moneys levied and collected in the Town for the repair and improvement of highways, the revenues from equipment rentals, reimbursement for snow and ice removal and other charges for services, the reappropriated funds, and the CHIPS and other State aid for highways, shall be expended as follows:

- 1A. GENERAL REPAIRS. All DA5110 accounts, DA5120 Bridges, DA5142 Snow Removal accounts, and DA5140 Brush & Weeds accounts in the amount of \$824,875.00 shall be set aside to be expended for basic work and general maintenance and repairs upon 91.42 miles of town highways, including sluices, drainage ditches, culverts and bridges having a span of less than five feet, tree and brush removal, board walks, sidewalks that are the responsibility of the Town, emergency activities as such are authorized by the Town Board, and other activities involved with the care, upkeep and maintenance of highways and bridges of the Town. Before any such work is undertaken, the Superintendent of Highways shall inform the Supervisor of the proposed work in order for the Supervisor to ascertain that the proposed work complies with the laws of New York and/or any Rules and Regulations relating thereto.
- 1B. PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS HIGHWAYS. Accounts DA5112.204 Town DA5112.205 Chips in the amount of \$509,000.00 shall be set aside to be expended for the permanent improvements of Town Highways. The Town Highways that are intended to be improved include:
 - a) On the highway known as Silver Spur Road for a distance of approximately 0.84 miles; consisting of the following work: 2 ½" black top approximately 20' wide.
 - b) On the highway known as M. Simons Road, a distance of 0.64 miles; consisting of the following work: 2 ½" black top approximately 20" wide.
 - c) On the highway known as Dalton Road, a distance of 0.18 miles; consisting of the following work: 2½' black top approximately 20' wide.
 - d) On the highway known as Joseph Kollar Road, a distance of 1.48 miles; consisting of the following work: 2 ½ black top approximately 20' wide.

Before any such work is undertaken, the Superintendent of Highways shall inform the Supervisor of the proposed work in order for the Supervisor to ascertain that the proposed work complies with the laws of New York and/or any Rules and Regulations relating thereto.

- 1C. Remainder of DA5112.2 moneys to be used on various roads in the Town of Cairo.
- 1D. Employee benefits DA9010.8 through DA9089.83 to be spent on employee's benefits.

TOWN OF CAIRO LOCAL LAW # OF 2012 REGULATING STORAGE BINS

§ 1. Title.

This local law shall be known and cited as "Storage Bin Regulation Local Law."

§ 2. Purpose.

The Town Board of the Town of Cairo finds and declares that the intrusion of non-regulated storage bins is causing annoyance to citizens in the Town of Cairo and may lead to negative visual impacts and potential health hazards. The provisions contained in this local law are intended to prohibit the placement of storage bins in the Town of Cairo except in accordance with the terms of this local law so as not to negatively impact the health and safety of the residents of the Town.

§3. Definitions.

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

STORAGE BINS: Any container utilized or intended to be utilized for the outdoor storage of items, including but not limited clothing, shoes, household items or any other personal property, to be collected, given, donated, stored, or distributed.

PERSONS: Individuals, partnerships, family groups, voluntary associations, entities, unincorporated organizations and corporations.

§4. Storage Bins Prohibited Without Permit. Conduct

- a. No person, corporation, entity, organization or group shall place a storage bin in any location within the Town of Cairo, except in the following locations and with the owners consent thereof, unless such person shall first obtain a permit from the Town:
 - i. Property owned by the Town of Cairo;
 - ii. Property owned by a duly organized fire company or district;
 - iii. Property owned by a church or other place of worship.
- b. It shall be the responsibility of the owner of the property and the owner of the storage bin to site bins in a location to shield bins from public view.
- c. No more than one (1) storage bin may be placed on any parcel of land within the Town of Cairo.
- d. It shall be the responsibility of the owner of the property and the owner of the storage bin to prevent dumping of trash, refuse, rubbish or any other items which are not the intended items for collection at the storage bin and to immediately remove such items from the parcel.

§5. Permit Process.

Prior to issuance of any storage bin permit, the persons applying for such permit shall file a written statement with the Code Enforcement Officer at least twenty business days in advance of the placement of a storage bin, setting forth the following information:

a. The full name and address of applicant.

- b. The location, including 911 address and tax map parcel number at which the proposed storage bin is to be placed.
- c. The starting and ending dates on which the storage bin shall be present.
- d. Written authority by the owner of the property on which the storage is to be placed, allowing the placement thereof.
- e. A sketch of the location on the parcel where the storage bin is to be placed, including the manner in which the storage bin shall be shielded from public view.
- f. A permit fee in amount to be set by the Town Board, as it from time to time, deems appropriate for the issuance of such permit.

§6. Enforcement; complaints.


This local law shall be enforced by the Building Department and/or the Town of Cairo Police Department, and it shall be their duty to investigate and prosecute any violation of this local law. If, after an investigation, a violation is found to exist, the Building Department shall prosecute a complaint before a court of appropriate jurisdiction, including but not limited to the Justice Court of the Town of Cairo.

§7. Violations and penalties.

- a. Any person, firm or corporation who or which shall violate any provision of this Local Law shall, upon conviction thereof, be guilty of a violation as that term is defined in the New York State Penal Law and shall be sentenced in accordance therewith. Every day that a violation of this Local Law continues shall constitute a separate offense.
- b. Following a finding by a court of appropriate jurisdiction, including the Justice Court of the Town of Cairo, the Town shall be authorized to immediately remove the storage bin and any items in, on, around or near such storage bin.
- c. If the owner shall fail to pay the costs and expenses associated with such removal within 10 days after being notified of the same by mail, the Town Clerk shall file, prior to the time for completing the levy of annual town taxes, a certificate of said cost and expense with a statement as to the property upon which the same were incurred, with the Town Board, which shall in the preparation of the next annual tax levy of general town taxes, levy said amounts upon such property, and the same shall be levied, collected and enforced in the same manner, by the same proceedings at the same time, with the same penalties, and having the same lien upon the property assessed as the general town tax and as a part thereof.

§8. Miscellaneous

- a. This Local Law is expressly adopted pursuant to the relevant sections of the New York State Town Law and the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.
- b. In the event any section or provision of the laws contained herein or as amended hereafter shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the laws as a whole or any part thereof other that the part so declared to be invalid.
- c. This local law shall be effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

Dear Supervisor Banta:

By letter dated July 7, 2010, you were advised that the Town of Cairo qualifies for principal forgiveness funds through the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) in an amount no greater than \$1,920,750, for the wastewater infrastructure project referenced above. I am pleased to report that the estimated principal forgiveness amount has been increased to be no greater than \$2,000,000.
