ORDER

BY ORDER OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CAIRO:

WHEREAS, John W. Wernert Sr. is the owner of certain real property located at <u>4422 New York State Route 23</u>, Cairo, Greene County, New York, bearing Tax Map Number <u>100.00-2-6</u>; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Cairo received and reviewed a Report from the Town Code Enforcement Officer / Building Inspector regarding the unsafe condition of the said property and illegally having a salvage and junk yard on such real property in accordance with the requirements of Local Law 6 of 1985, and its regular meeting held on <u>January 9th, 2013</u>, in particular the condition of the premises is as follows:

Large accumulations of miscellaneous junk and debris, unregistered/dismantled or dilapidated motor vehicles on the above said property.

NOW THEREFORE THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CAIRO HEREBY DETERMINES AND ORDERS:

ORDERED, that the Town Board of the Town of Cairo shall hold a hearing on the <u>13th day of</u> <u>February</u> 2013 at the Town Hall, 512 Main Street, Cairo, New York at <u>4</u> pm regarding the unsafe condition of such real property and the remediation thereof, and it is further

ORDERED, that the Town Board of the Town of Cairo hereby determines that the said real property has become unsafe and dangerous by way of the following conditions:

The property has large amounts of miscellaneous junk and debris consisting of but not limited to scrap metal, wood pallets, tires, propane tanks and barrels which could be hazardous to the safety of the occupants of the property and any other persons who go onto the property. There also exists the possibility of fire, arson and other unsafe activities including the attraction of minors under the age of 18, and it is further

ORDERED, that the Owner, John W. Wernert Sr. is hereby directed to remove all miscellaneous junk and debris and any unregistered motor vehicles that are dismantled or in such disrepair from lack of maintenance at the said subject matter real property located at 4422 New York State Route 23, Cairo,

Greene County, New York, bearing Tax Map Number 100.00-2-6, such removal shall commence within 30 days of the date of the hearing and shall be completed within 60 days thereof unless for good cause shown by the land owner and extension is granted by the Town, and it is further

ORDERED, that in the event the Owner, John W. Wernert Sr. fails to complete such removal and repairs, the Town of Cairo shall have the right to complete such removal, and its is further

ORDERED, that in the event the Town of Cairo is required to complete the removal of all unregistered, dismantled or dilapidated motor vehicles and all miscellaneous junk and debris the Owner of such real property fails to reimburse the Town for the cost of same within 60 days of the date of the invoice of such costs served upon the Owner via certified return receipt requested mail, same shall be reported to the Greene County Treasurer and Greene County Real Property Tax Services and recorded as a lien upon such real property and collected as a special ad valorem levy thereon in accordance with Article 15 of the Real Property Tax Law, all in accordance with Sections 4 through 10 of Local Law #2 of 1990 of the Town of Cairo, entitled "Unsafe Buildings"

Minutes

Town of Cairo Town Board Meeting @7pm Location: Town Hall Meeting Room

January 23, 2013

The Town Board of the Town of Cairo met for a Town Board meeting on Wednesday, January 23, 2013 at the Town Hall, Main Street, Cairo, New York.

Supervisor Ted Banta, called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM and then asked the attendees to Pledge Allegiance to the Flag. The following Board Members were in attendance: Councilpersons Ostrander, Councilperson Suttmeier and Councilperson Joyce.

Elizabeth Brinkerhoff gave report on the Town Park. She informed Board of the ribbon cutting scheduled for Saturday, May 4, 2013. The ribbon cutting is for the state of the art basketball equipment that was donated by the Bank of Greene County and also for the red swing set that was purchased through donations. She also reported Edith Canna gave \$300 towards the advertising, posters and Picnic for the ribbon cutting.

Supervisor Banta thanked Elizabeth Brinkerhoff for her efforts in the Town Park.

Supervisor Banta informed public that the Greene County Legislature gave the Cairo Library the Ellen Rettes Planning Achievement Award.

Steven and Julie Freeman were introduced as the new owners of the Cedar Terrace on Main Street. Supervisor Banta thanked them for contributing to the town. Steve Freeman explained they have some great ideas for Cedar Terrace but it basically will remain very similar to the way it is now. The minutes from the January 2, 2013 Reorganizational Meeting was accepted by Councilperson Joyce and seconded by Councilperson Suttmeier.

The minutes from the January 9, 2013 Workshop Meeting was accepted by Councilperson Joyce and seconded by Councilperson Ostrander.

The Town Board went over the Department Reports.

Supervisor Banta went over the Supervisor's Report. (See Supervisor's Report)

Police Office Rick Busch was commended for being proactive with his presence at the

Cairo Elementary School. The Town is fortunate to have him with our force.

On January 3, 2013 Supervisor Banta met with Principal Scott Richards. There was a tour of both schools by local agencies. They are trying to be more proactive and assess any safety issues in the schools.

Supervisor Banta showed the public one of the banners from Cairo Historical Society for Hometown Heroes. The deadline for applications is March 31, 2013. He also reported that the American Legion agreed to donate the \$2100.00 for brackets and the Town will be shipping in the amount of \$150.00. The banners will hang in Town from the middle of May to the middle of July each year.

It was reported that Hannaford will be starting the demolition next week. It should take about 9 months to get the store built.

Emily Feeney, Tax Collector for the Town of Cairo has been ill and is in the hospital. Supervisor Banta will be sending flowers to her.

Councilperson Ostrander has been doing a lot of research on solar energy. He gave an update on his meeting with New York Light Energy, Mark Anderson, contact. Councilperson Ostrander is researching on bringing solar energy to the community. There is a company that would set up a PPA- purchase agreement which the town doesn't have to put any money up front. The Town would make a long term commitment with this company of about 20 years and they come in and put the solar panels in. They take the tax credits from it and they sell us energy at a much lower rate than we are paying right now. They do all the maintenance on the system.

Supervisor Banta asked to get three months worth of electric bills from Lisa Jillek from the C-D School District to have the school evaluated with this company.

The Cairo Chamber of Commerce would like to have space in the annex building. The Town will set up a Lease at market value with them. To offset the rent, the Chamber could agree to do some services for the Town or run festivals or programs. Claudia Zucker said she would be agreeable to that. Supervisor Banta will speak to Attorney Tal Rappleyea to draw up the contracts.

RESOLVED, that the Town Board Members accept the monthly Supervisor's Report for December, 2012.

Dr. Stacey Russell and wife Susan Russell reported to the Board that they never had a problem on High Ridge Villa in the last 4 years. On Friday, January 18th the Highway Dept. was filling in potholes on their road and in the last couple of days they experienced 3 flat tires. They asked what kind of stone was used. They also have not had a road sign there in 6 months and are concerned about emergency personnel finding them. Deputy Highway Superintendent Debi Sommer will order a road sign. The Russell's want to know the intentions of the Town to improve this Town road so others can build there. Superintendent of Highways Robert Hempstead he might be able to oil and stone it.

Ambulance Administrator Reay Mahler reported they won the bid on the used ambulance for \$10,600.

RESOLUTION EXEMPTION OF GREENE COUNTY FROM TOWN LAND USE LAWS TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CAIRO June 26, 2008

WHEREAS, Greene County (the "Applicant") has requested that the Town Board of the Town Cairo make a determination with regard to whether it shall be exempt from the applicability of the Town's land use laws in relation to its proposal to construct a multi-use soccer field on Mountain Ave., Cairo, NY; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board recognizes that there is significant case law on point, with regard to the exemption of such a project including <u>In the Matter of the County of Monroe</u>, 72 NY2d 338 (1988), which held that a balancing test must be performed to determine whether a project of a municipality or agency thereof, is exempt from the local land use regulation weighing the following factors: 1) Legislative intent; 2) Nature and scope of the instrumentality seeking immunity; 3) The kind of function or land use involved; 4) The extent of the public interest to be served; 5) The effect local land use regulation would have on the enterprise; 6) Impact on legitimate local interests; 7) Alternative locations for the facility in less restrictive zoning areas; 8) Alternative methods of providing the needed improvement; 9) Intergovernmental participation in the project development process; and 10) Opportunity of the public and others to be heard; and the <u>Nanuet Fire Engine Co. No. 1, Inc. v. Amster</u>, 177 Misc. 2d 296 (Rockland County S. Ct., 1998) wherein the Count determined that the construction of fire houses are municipal projects and must undergo the <u>County of Monroe</u> "balancing test" to determine whether such action is exempt from local land use regulation; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant, Greene County, is a municipal corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, specifically the project includes a proposal to construct a multi-use soccer field and adjacent parking lot both for public use; and

<u>Report to DEC</u> – I have collected copies of reports from Joe for the last three years and tabulated data to show No Violations.

I spoke with Bob H. and gave him (today) a list of what I think we need to document his I&I control and repair work.

A draft of the letter, without tables or photographs is enclosed for your review.

<u>Sewer Plant</u> – Start-up tests were done on the pump station. When the weather improves Casale will be back to hook in the piping and take out the old station.

At the plant Schoenecker is to the point of putting PVC aeration pipe in the tanks. These get water and ice in them and can be easily damaged. He does not want to do it till weather improves and I think it is just asking for trouble to push that. I did request that he get there and start outing metal railings, etc. up. The electrician says he is not going to lay buried conduit since his machine is not large enough. Not much else to report there.

<u>Water Project</u> – I talked to Dave Phillips and reminded him he needs to review the Engineering Report as he said he would in ½ e-mail. He is pretty good about that I think he just forgot. I spoke with Chris Rienzo at EFC to see what we need to do to access money at EFC. I forwarded him correspondence with DOH and he will talk with them about what steps we need to take.

We fortunately will not need a bond counsel because the loan was already made years ago. I am not clear what we need to do with SEQR and need to talk with Tal. It was probably done before but I doubt the paperwork is still there from 10+ years ago.

If needed, he may have a resolution for the Town to be the SEQR "Lead Agency." The coordinated review takes some time so it would be good to get that out of the way now.

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



Hi Everyone

At last evening's Park Task Force meeting it was reported that damage was done to the new large field home plate back stop overhang. Apparently this damage was caused by an undetermined cause. It could have been storm damage but could also have been vandalism. According to David Robinson, the Cairo Little league representative, the damage was reported to their organization by Steven Rumph. The fence contractor was called by the Little League to assess the damage. The contractor felt that he did not want the liability of leaving the damage un-repaired. The contractor repaired the damage in the amount of \$300.

The Little League paid the repair invoice and was inquiring about the Town's responsibility in this matter. I advised him that some inquiries need to be made before a decision can be made.

Discussion:

In recent past the Board made an announcement that all property in the Park should be the responsibility of the Town. This decision was made to remove all the territorial claims by various entities in the Town. Since the ball fields are in the Town Park the following action should have been taken <u>prior</u> to any repairs being made:

1. If the damage was noted by the Park, Buildings and Grounds Dept, the damage should have been reported to the police for their determination. Obviously if it was vandalism a criminal investigation would have been conducted with appropriate evidence and photos. If not at least an impartial party would have rendered their opinion. This information would have given the Board the opportunity to make an informed decision.

- 2. The Town insurance carrier would have been contacted for their assessment of the damage.
- 3. The repair would have performed by the respective contractor

Since the scenario did not occur in this manner there is no way of determining how or why the damage occurred. I believe Steven Rumph should be interviewed by the Highway Superintendent to determine exactly how this was reported and the results given to the Board for further action and determination.

A policy should be developed as to what action the Town should take when damage is noticed.

These are my thoughts on the reported incident. At the Board Workshop, the Board should discuss any action they should take based on the findings that the Highway Superintendent is able to gather.

DiNapoli: Municipalities Should Ensure Background Checks For Youth Program Workers

Local governments could do more to conduct background checks on individuals working in municipal youth program services, according to <u>an audit</u> released today by New York State Comptroller Thomas P. DiNapoli.

"Failing to perform background checks potentially jeopardizes the safety of children," said DiNapoli. "It is essential that local officials take action to ensure they are consistently screening all persons who provide youth program services in their communities. Parents need to trust that all of the necessary steps have been taken to keep their children out of harm's way."

From Jan. 2010 through May 2012, auditors examined youth program activities in the cities of Binghamton, Middletown, New Rochelle and Utica; as well as the towns of Amherst, Clifton Park, Manlius and Seneca Falls. These municipalities offer activities to more than 409,000 residents.

The Comptroller's audit found seven of the eight municipalities did not conduct background checks on all of the individuals who deliver their youth program services. Only one, the town of Clifton Park, annually screened all program personnel against the state's sex offender registry and other resources.

Two municipalities, the town of Manlius and the city of New Rochelle, did not screen applicants at all, except for those personnel providing programs where state law mandates screening. The remaining five municipalities performed some screening, but did not do it consistently or did not document the date and results of the screening process.

Of the 1,994 individuals working in youth program services in these municipalities, the Comptroller's audit did not identify any persons with sex offender or significant criminal histories.

The Comptroller's audit findings also include:

- · Four of the five municipalities that used volunteers did not check volunteers' criminal history;
- Five municipalities that hired contracted workers to offer program services did not screen these workers for sexual offenses prior to delivering services; and
- · Six municipalities performed some variety of background checks for new employees.


Municipal youth programs can include pre-school or afterschool activities, arts and crafts, exercise and fitness, summer camps, seasonal or holiday special events, sports, employment and literacy programs, safety programs, swim programs and therapeutic programs. Background checks are currently required by state law or regulation only for individuals who have contact with children in camps, childcare programs and therapeutic programs.

DiNapoli recommended municipalities conduct background checks for all employees, volunteers and contractors involved in youth programs. Minimally, local officials should utilize the sex offender registry maintained by the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services. They can also perform various types of criminal history background checks and develop their own procedures to limit liability and ensure the safety of participating children.

Local officials generally agreed with the audit findings and the Comptroller's recommendations. Their responses are included in the final audit report.


