Town Board Meeting @ 7:00pm

**Location: Town Hall Meeting Room** 

#### February 5, 2018

The Town Board of the Town of Cairo met for a Town Board Meeting on Monday, February 5, 2018 at the Town Hall, Main Street, Cairo, New York.

Supervisor Benoit called the meeting to order at 7:05pm and asked the attendees to Pledge Allegiance to the Flag with all board members present.

The Karl Heck gave a presentation and sample resolution supporting the Cairo Development Foundation grant application.

#### Public Hearing on parcel change designation from Rural Residential to Commercial/Industry

Supervisor Benoit opened the public hearing with Al Suwara and the change parcel designation from Rural Residential to Commercial/Industry. Mr. Suwara displayed maps and spoke about zoning change. Questions arose about Mr. Suwara selling the property. He stated the property is not for sale. The residents showed concern over future use of the property.

Public Hearing on reducing Planning Board Members from 7 to 5 members

Supervisor Benoit explained the reasoning for reducing 7 to 5 member board. A resident questioned the fact of reducing the board will possibly effect having a quorum to hold meetings. Town Attorney, Tal Rappleyea stated most towns have 5 member boards.

#### Public Hearing on changing verbiage in zoning law: Change ZEO with CEO

The changing of the Zoning Law from ZEO to CEO was discussed. Supervisor Benoit explained the elimination of the Zoning Enforcement Officer and the assignment of the Code Enforcement Officer.

Supervisor Benoit updated the board on the water system upgrades. Town Board discussed the possibility of purchasing land for a municipal well.

Supervisor Benoit stated the sidewalk project is on schedule and within the budget.

The soccer field is moving forward and will start in March weather permitting.

Supervisor Benoit stated that he has not heard back from the New York State Department of Health regarding Watts Pig Farm.

Supervisor Benoit said they are in negotiations with the Ambulance and will be having future meetings.

Supervisor Benoit spoke about Good Energy aggregation on savings of electricity and will look further into this possibility.

Village of Catskill wants to have a meeting with the Town of Cairo regarding Country Estates water hook-up.

Elayne Gold sent a letter regarding Employee Training on a managerial/supervisory level.

Supervisor Benoit stated that the Town of Cairo has intentions of entering into a PILOT agreement with Cypress Creek Renewables.

Discussion arose regarding Proposed Peddlers License Law.

Revising the town's fee schedule will have a committee consisting of Stacey Sprague, Code Enforcement Officer, Councilperson Mary Jo Cords and Councilperson Jason Watts..

The Board of Assessment Review sent a letter requesting the courtroom May 22, 2018 for grievance day and also requesting a police officer to be present.

Photographs of town Hall - Sherry True and Robert Uzzilla would be putting photographs up in the town hall. Looking for historical photographs

A letter was received from Whitbeck, Benedick & Smith that they were interested in becoming the town attorney. They were thanked and they were informed that the Town Of Cairo has an attorney.

The EPA Lead Training Notification was discussed.

The Town Board received a letter from the Eagle Scouts on the award ceremony for Dominic Manoli on April 14, 2018 @ 7pm at the Acra Community Center if anyone could attend.

The Town Board received another Eagle Scout award Ceremony for Steven Maurer February 11,2018 @ 2pm in the Athens Firehouse if anyone could attend.

Discussion arose on the Cairo Fire District increase in Service Award Program.

### Resolution #2018-050 "Purchase Two (2) One Way Plows"

**RESOLVED**, the Town Board does hereby authorize the Highway Superintendent to purchase one (1) One Way Plows from Viking Cives under Oneida County contract number 1889.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that purchase price will not exceed \$7,000.00.

The resolution was not clear on the amount of plows to be ordered and would hold off on voting on the resolution at this time. Resolution tabled.

WHEREAS, the Town Board has engaged the services of a certified public accountant to make an agreed-upon procedures engagement conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants to be completed within 60 days after the close of the town's fiscal year; therefore be it

**RESOLVED**, the Town Board does hereby accept the Independent Accountants' Report for the Justice Court as presented for fiscal year end 2017.

# Resolution No. 2018-056 - RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CAIRO AUTHORIZING THE ADOPTION OF THE GREENE COUNTY HAZARD MITIGATION AND RESLIENCE PLAN

Offered by Councilperson Joyce, Seconded by Councilperson Watts

**WHEREAS**, all of Greene County has exposure to natural hazards that increase the risk to life, property, environment and the County's economy; and

**WHEREAS,** pro-active mitigation of known hazards before a disaster event can reduce long-term risk to life and property; and

**WHEREAS,** the Town/Village of Cairo, with the assistance from AECOM, has gathered information and assisted in the preparation of the Greene County Hazard Mitigation and Resilience Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (Public Law 106-390) established new requirements for pre- and post- disaster hazards mitigation programs and the Greene County Hazard Mitigation and Resilience Plan has been prepared in accordance with this Act; and

**WHEREAS**, a Mitigation Planning Committee of Greene County municipalities with like planning objectives was formed to create consistent mitigation strategies within Greene County; and

WHEREAS, the Mitigation Planning Committee has completed a planning process that engaged the public, assessed the risk and vulnerability to the impacts of natural hazards, developed a mitigation strategy consistent with a set of uniform goals and objectives, and created a plan for implementing, evaluating and revising this strategy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town/Village of Cairo:

1. Adopts in its entirety the Greene County Hazard Mitigation and Resilience Plan (the "Plan") as the County's Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan, and resolves to execute the actions identified in the Plan that pertain to the County;

- 2. Will use the adopted and approved portions of the Plan to guide pre- and post-disaster mitigation of the hazards identified;
- 3. Will coordinate the strategies identified in the Plan with other planning programs and mechanisms under its jurisdictional authority;
- 4. Will continue its support of the Mitigation Planning Committee as described in the Plan;
- 5. Will help to promote and support the mitigation successes of all participants in this Plan;
- Will incorporate mitigation planning as an integral component of government and partner operations; and
- 7. Will provide an update of the Plan in conjunction with the County Plan participants no less than every five years.
