ATTENTION ALL GREENE COUNTY RESIDENTS

Governor Andrew M. Cuomo introduced the "New York State Plastic Bag Waste Reduction Act," in the 2019/20 State Budget which institutes a statewide ban on single use plastic bags and empowers counties and cities to impose a \$0.05 fee on paper bags.

It applies to retail outlets required to pay sales tax. There are exemptions for several types of plastic bags: bags used to wrap uncooked meat/fish; bags used to package bulk items like produce and candy; bags that contain food sliced or prepared to order; bags used for newspaper delivery; bags sold in bulk at point of sale; trash bags; food storage bags; garment bags; bags prepackaged for sale to a customer; bags used to carry out or deliver restaurant food; and bags provided by a pharmacy to carry prescription drugs.

The adopted New York State legislation institutes a statewide ban on single-use plastic bags, effective March 1, 2020. **NOTE:** The Greene County Legislature has opted NOT TO IMPOSE the optional \$0.05 fee on paper bags. While individual businesses may choose to charge their customers for paper bags, the county will not impose or collect any associated fee.

The New York State Association of Counties (<u>NYSAC</u>) issued a white paper titled <u>Plastic Bags:</u> <u>Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, and More</u> which provides guidance for municipalities on implementation of the New York State Bag Waste Reduction Act (A.2008C/S.1508C, Part H).

And did you know . . .

Greene County Real Property Tax Services Geographic Information Services (GIS) division has launched a new and improved public parcel viewer application, otherwise known as the Greene Web Map. It can be accessed at https://gis.gcgovny.com/greenewebmap/or clicking the icon on greenegovernment.com.

The Greene Web Map continues to be linked with their partner site, Greene County SDG Image Mate Online for current parcel assessment information as well as parcel history for recorded deed and map information.

The Greene Web Map is the fourth iteration of the parcel viewer application initially launched in 2006. The application leverages the latest ESRI JavaScript API and ArcGIS Portal. With the new application they are no longer dependent on a third party to add additional Greene County layers and in the near future will be adding layers such as Election Districts, Polling Sites and Greene County's Natural Resource Inventory. In addition, they are now able to consume other map services into the parcel viewer such as FEMA National Flood Hazard Layers and DEC Information Layers.



Announcements from the Greene County Legislature

Resolution No. 388-19

Increasing Amount Of Income For Senior Citizen Tax Exemption

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law, persons sixty-five (65) years of age or over who are owners of real property shall be exempt from County taxes to the extent of fifty per centum (50%) of the assessed valuation if said owners fulfill certain qualifications, including a limited income which does not exceed an amount fixed by this Legislature;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the income of the owner, or the combined income of owners of real property who are sixty-five (65) years of age or over must not exceed \$29,000.00; and be it further RESOLVED, that this income amount shall be effective for the assessment rolls to be completed and filed beginning in 2020; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the "sliding scale" provisions of Real Property Tax Law Section 467 paragraph 1 (b)(1) adopted by this Legislature by Resolution No. 583-01 on December 19, 2001 and Real Property Tax Law Section 467 paragraph 1(b)(2) and 1(b)(3) adopted by this Legislature by Resolution No. 477-04 on December 15, 2004 shall remain in effect.

Resolution No. 389-19

Supporting Adoption Of Senate Bill S.428-A And Assembly Bill A.47-A By New York State Legislature Regarding The Prohibition Of The Sale And Distribution Of Flavored Eliquid For Use In E-Cigarettes

WHEREAS, Senate Bill S.428-A and Assembly Bill A.47-A have been introduced in the State Legislature to prohibit the sale and distribution of flavored "e-liquids" for use in electronic cigarettes and electronic cigarettes containing such flavoring; and

WHEREAS, many e-cigarette and liquid nicotine products come in flavors that are attractive to young people, such as cherry, fruit punch, chocolate and cola; and

WHEREAS, recent studies by the Food and Drug Administration and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention show a marked increase in the use of e-cigarettes and liquid nicotine by middle and high school students; and

WHEREAS, in the past year, the percentage of middle school students using e-cigarettes has increased by 50%, with use by high school students increasing by 80%; and

WHEREAS, the most commonly cited reasons for using e-cigarettes among both youth and young adults are curiosity, fruit and candy flavorings offered by liquid nicotine manufacturers and the low-perceived harm compared to other tobacco products; and

WHEREAS, limiting liquid nicotine to tobacco flavor available for purchase would reduce children's interest in using these products while allowing adults the option to continue e-cigarettes as a replacement for traditional tobacco products or for smoking cessation purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislature finds that it is necessary to protect and promote the public health, safety and welfare of the youth and young adults residing in Greene County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Greene County Legislature hereby supports and urges the adoption of Senate Bill S.428-A and Assembly Bill A.47-A; and be it further resolved that the Clerk of the Legislature is hereby directed to forward copies of this Resolution to Governor Cuomo, Senate Majority Leader Stewart-Cousins; Assembly Speaker Carl E. Heastie; Assembly Committee on Health Chairman Gottfried; Senate Committee on Health Chairman Rivera; New York State Senator George A. Amedore, Jr.; New York State Assemblyman Christopher Tague; the New York State Association of Counties and the New York State Public Health Association.

HOMEBOUND MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION

Greene County Department of Human Services provides Medical Transportation, courtesy of a volunteer driver, to Greene County residents age 60 or older who do not have any other available options for transportation to medical appointments. This service is available to medical facilities located in Greene County, as well as the neighboring counties of Albany, Columbia, Delaware, Schoharie and Ulster. All medical transportation for clients will be **restricted to four (4) times a month**. **Appointments must be scheduled for Monday - Friday, 8:30 a.m. through 2:00 p.m.**

We require clients to call our office <u>at least two weeks</u> prior to the appointment so that we can schedule the transportation with a volunteer driver.



We are unable to transport clients covered by Medicaid.

Greene County Department of Human Services offers a wheelchair-accessible shopping bus to Greene County residents, age 60 or older that live in the towns of Ashland, Athens, Cairo, Catskill, Coxsackie, Greenville, Hunter, Jewett, Lexington, Prattsville and Windham. Our friendly driver will pick up seniors

at their door, bring them to Catskill for shopping, and take them to a local Senior Service Center for lunch before returning home. All trips are limited to 16 people; first come are first served. There is a limit of two shopping bags per person.

For many older adults, **OSTEOPOROSIS** is part of daily life. In fact, three million New Yorkers over the age of 50 have osteoporosis or are at risk for developing it. While this condition can weaken bones, making them thin and increasing the risk for fractures, education on the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of osteoporosis can help improve outcomes.

The New York State Osteoporosis Prevention and Education Program's (NYSOPEP) Statewide Osteoporosis Resource Center, part of the New York State Department of Health, was created in 1997 as the go-tolocation for information on osteoporosis.

Medicare Part D, the prescription drug benefit, is the part of Medicare that covers most outpatient prescription drugs. Part D is offered through private companies either as a stand-alone plan, for those enrolled in Original Medicare, or as a set of benefits included with your Medicare Powered by the Medicare Rights Center Advantage Plan.

Unless you have creditable drug coverage and will have a Special Enrollment Period, you should enroll in Part D when you first get Medicare. If you delay enrollment, you may face gaps in coverage and enrollment penalties.

Each Part D plan has a list of covered drugs, called its formulary. If your drug is not on the formulary, you may have to request an exception, pay out-of-pocket, or file an appeal.

A drug category is a group of drugs that treat the same symptoms or have similar effects on the body. All Part D plans must include at least two drugs from most categories and must cover all drugs available in the following categories:

- HIV/AIDS treatments
- Antidepressants
- Antipsychotic medications
- Anticonvulsive treatments for seizure disorders
- Immunosuppressant drugs
- Anticancer drugs (unless covered by Part B)

Part D plans must also cover most vaccines, except for vaccines covered by Part B. Some drugs are explicitly excluded from Medicare coverage by law, including drugs used to treat weight loss or gain, and over-the-counter drugs.

Note: For certain drugs or under specific circumstances, your drugs may be covered by Part A or Part B.

FEBRUARY IS AMERICAN HEART MONTH

A well-balanced healthy food plan can help maintain heart health

Ways to create a healthy meal plan:

- Control portion sizes use smaller plates and bowls.
- Consume more fruits and vegetables they are low in calories and high in fiber.
- Choose whole grains another good source of fiber.
- Limit unhealthy fats saturated and trans fats to improve blood cholesterol.
- Choose lean meats, poultry, fish, low fat dairy products and eggs; ideal options are legumes, beans and lentils.
- Reduce sodium intake in the food you consume: less than 2400 milligrams per day.
- Plan ahead! Create a weekly menu.
- Treats! Don't forget to give yourself a treat once in a while, just not all the time.
- EXERCISE! Stay Active, join a gym, grab your friend and take a walk.

Omega 3 Fatty Acids are Healthy Fats – Choose oily fish such as tuna, salmon, sardines, herring, and trout. These can help lower triglyceride levels - fats that clogs arteries.

Mono-Unsaturated Fats - Include oils such as canola, olive, peanut, avocado, nuts and avocados. These can help lower the "bad" (LDL) cholesterol and raise the "good" (HDL) cholesterol.

Poly-Unsaturated Fats - Include vegetable oils such as sunflower, sesame, safflower, soybean and corn. These can help lower the "bad" (LDL) cholesterol.

Saturated fat is unhealthy fat – It is found mostly in animal sources or solid fats such as butter, stick margarine, skin on chicken, fat in meats, shortening, lard, etc.










Pneumococcal vaccine timing for adults 65 years or older

Eligibility

Medicare Part B covers two separate pneumonia vaccines. Part B covers the first shot if you have never received Part B coverage for a pneumonia shot before. You are covered for a different, second vaccination one year after receiving the first shot.

You are not required to provide a vaccination history when receiving the pneumonia vaccine. You can verbally tell the health care professional administering the shot if/when you have received past shots.

Costs

If you qualify, Original Medicare covers pneumonia shots at 100% of the Medicare-approved amount when you receive the service from a participating provider. This means you pay nothing (no deductible or coinsurance). Medicare Advantage Plans are required to cover pneumonia shots without applying deductibles, copayments, or coinsurance when you see an in-network provider and meet Medicare's eligibility requirements for the service.

During the course of your pneumonia shot, your provider may discover and need to investigate or treat a new or existing problem. This additional care is considered diagnostic, meaning your provider is treating you because of certain symptoms or risk factors. Medicare may bill you for any diagnostic care you receive during a preventive visit.

<u>CONSULTATION and ASSISTANCE:</u> This includes such client assistance activities as case assistance, HIICAP, help with public benefit applications, etc.

The suggested level of contribution is \$5.00 per office visit (Actual cost \$20.00/hour).

IN-HOME SERVICES: This is discussed with the client by the case manager at the time of assessment.

The suggested level of contribution is \$3.00 per hour (A ctual cost \$21.56/hour).

LEGAL SERVICES

The suggested level of contribution is \$10.00 per attorney consultation (Actual cost \$149.00/hour).

NUTRITION:

Senior Congregate Meal or Home Delivered Meals:

The suggested level of contribution is \$4.00 (Actual cost \$12.01/meal).

Nutrition Counseling - Clients requesting diet counseling from the Registered Dietitian are provided with an opportunity to contribute.

The suggested level of contribution is \$5.00. (Actual cost \$65.00/hour).

The suggested level of contribution is \$3.00 round trip (A ctual cost \$15.08/one way).

The suggested contribution is \$1.00 for round trip (Actual cost: \$7.34/one way).

The suggested contribution for this service is a sliding scale based on mileage

0 – 10 miles \$3.00 round trip 11 – 20 miles \$5.00 round trip 21 – 40 miles \$9.00 round trip 41+ miles \$15.00 round trip

Driving requires the ability to react quickly to a variety of circumstances. Because of this, a person living with Alzheimer's will, at some point, be unable to drive. Planning ahead can help ease the transition. Plan to discuss how retirement from driving will be handled before it becomes an issue. Be sympathetic as you address the topic because retiring from driving and the perceived loss of independence is difficult for many. It is important to acknowledge a person's feelings and preserve his or her independence, while ensuring the person's safety and the safety of others.

Warning signs of unsafe driving:

Forgetting how to locate familiar places Making slow or poor decisions in traffic

Becoming angry or confused while driving Using poor lane control

Confusing the brake and gas pedals

Failing to observe traffic signs Driving at an inappropriate speed

Hitting curbs

Making errors at intersections

Returning from a routine drive later than usual

Forgetting the destination you are driving to during the trip

In starting the conversation:

- Initiate a dialogue to express your concerns. Stress the positive and offer alternatives.
- Address resistance while reaffirming your unconditional love and support.
- Appeal to the person's sense of responsibility.
- Ask your physician to advise the person not to drive. Involving your physician in a family conference on driving may be more effective than trying to persuade the person not to drive by yourself. Ask the physician to write a letter or prescription stating that the person with Alzheimer's must not drive. You can then use the document to remind your family member what's been decided.
- Consider an evaluation by an objective third party.

Some people give up driving easily, but for others this transition can be very difficult. Be prepared for the person to become angry with you, due to the memory and insight issues that are part of Alzheimer's. Remember to:

- Be patient and firm. Demonstrate understanding and empathy.
- Acknowledge the pain of this change and appeal to the person's desire to act responsibly.
- Ask a respected family authority figure or your attorney to reinforce the message about not driving.
- If the conversation does not go well, do not blame yourself. The disease can impair insight and judgment, making it difficult for people to understand that their driving is no longer safe. Also the disease can cause mood and personality changes that make reactions more pronounced.
- As a last resort, take away the car keys, disable the car or consider selling the car. When you do any of these things, be sure to provide safe, reliable alternative transportation.

Alternative transportation options

There are options available that will allow individuals to continue to travel independently and remain in control of their mobility. Try being a passenger rather than the driver by having family members and friends provide transportation. Older adults can use local community services for special transportation. Take advantage of delivery service for prescription medicines, groceries or meals.






