The Greene County Department of Human Services is always looking for volunteer drivers to assist Homebound Senior Citizens. Anyone can volunteer there is no age requirement. How can you help?

Deliver meals – We have numerous routes to offer from our 5 sites:

- Acra site: Town of Cairo
- Athens: site: Village and Town of Athens, Freehold, and Greenville
- Catskill site: Town & Village of Catskill, and South Cairo
- Coxsackie site: Town & Village of Coxsackie
- Jewett site: Hunter, Lexington, Tannersville and Windham.

Medical Transportation – For appointments located in Greene County, as well as in the nearby counties of Albany, Columbia, Delaware, Dutchess, Rensselaer, Schoharie and Ulster.

You can tell us what days, times and routes/locations where you would be comfortable serving and we will schedule appropriately. For a commitment as little as an hour one day a week, you will be making a difference in the life of your elderly homebound neighbors. You will even receive a tax exempt reimbursement at the current IRS rate per mile! Please note that a mandatory background check must be completed prior to acceptance as a volunteer.



be it Shopping, Medical Appointment, or Lunch at a Senior Site*?

The Dept. of Human Services just may have an answer!

SHOPPING: We offer a free shopping bus.

Our friendly driver will **pick up seniors at their door**, bring them to an area store for shopping, and then take them to a local Senior Service Center for lunch, if desired, before returning home.

Trips are limited to 16 people; first come, first served. Wheelchair accessible.

We ask that you call at least one (1) business day in advance to make arrangements.

NUTRITON: Our Department chauffeur will transport seniors, without a means of personal transportation, to a Nutrition site to enjoy the noontime meal.

*This service is only available to seniors who reside within specific Catskill/Athens areas.

MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION: Our Department provides Medical Transportation, courtesy of a volunteer driver, to residents who do not have any other available options for transportation to appointments.

We are unable to transport clients covered by Medicaid.

The service is available to medical facilities located in Greene County, as well as Albany, Columbia, Delaware, Duchess, Rensselaer, Schoharie and Ulster.

Appointments must be scheduled for Monday - Friday, 8:30 through 2:00.

We do require clients to call our office <u>at least two weeks</u> prior to the appointment so that we can schedule the transportation with a volunteer driver.

GREENE COUNTY TRANSIT: GCT offers safe, affordable, reliable daily public transportation services throughout Greene County. Residents who are 60 years or older can register to ride GCT, fully subsidized. To register for a senior coupon book, contact the Greene County Department of Human Services at 518-719-3555 **Or** ride the bus, paying for the fare, and ask the driver for a registration form. You can either return the completed form to the driver or return directly to DHS. For further information, call 518-943-3625.

Get help paying for Medicare costs

A Medicare Savings Program (MSP) can help you save over \$7,200 per year in health care costs.

If your income is below or around the limit, you may qualify for an MSP, which pays for your Medicare Part B premium and automatically enrolls you in Extra Help, the federal prescription drug cost assistance program.

Even if your income is close to the limit, it is often worth applying.

March is National Nutrition Month

Over 50 years ago, the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics named March -National Nutrition Month. Registered Dietitians work year around to spread awareness about the field of dietetics, but we take extra strides during the month of March to improve public awareness. Topics include how to develop healthful eating strategies, ways to increase physical activity levels, and making better dietary choices.



The theme changes annually, and this year the slogan is "Fuel for the Future". Under this header there are many strategies to make food choices that better impact our environmental sustainability. This enables our ability to protect the planet's natural resources, maintain ecological balance, and overall promote longevity of these resources for future generations.

We have control over our food purchasing. Buying local food sustainable and shopping for items in season can greatly benefit the environment long term, but how?



- $\stackrel{\wedge}{\bowtie}$ Less "food miles." The term refers to the total distance food can travel from its origin to the supermarket. Food is delivered by cars, large trucks, and planes. The longer the transport, the more fuel is used, releasing harmful gas emissions into the contributes to pollution, and increased need for prolonged refrigeration, air. This also requiring energy.
- * Support your local farms, markets and farm stands. Many farmers choose to grow crops without the use of pesticides or other harmful chemicals, therefore protecting water and air from exposure and pollution. In addition, the food is fresh, you know where it comes from, and you are supporting local farmers who engage in sustainable farming.

Seasonal food choices decrease environmental impact. If food is in transit for longer periods, there is increased chance of food waste/spoilage. Foods in season, and local, use less energy for production therefore less waste accumulates. You can also choose foods with minimal packaging to ensure there will be less waste produced.

REGISTERED DIETITIAN NUTRITIONIST

A Registered Dietitian can help you establish new habits that support sustainability.

The Department of Human Services offers nutrition counseling about healthy eating, wellness and healthy habits. You don't need to get meals to discuss with the dietitian. Any senior wishing information is encouraged to call and ask for me, Nicole Gehman, RD, at the main office, 518-719-3555.



GREENE COUNTY DEPARTMENT of HUMAN SERVICES CONTRIBUTIONS POLICY

For services under the Older Americans Act and in Community Services for the Elderly and Expanded In-Home Services for the Elderly projects which propose contributions, such contributions must be used for costs allowable under applicable regulations and incurred during the budget period that contributions were received. The suggested contributions will not be more than the actual cost of the service. The purpose is to offer participants the opportunity to contribute and to increase the units of services, particularly to those in greatest need. Envelopes are provided to participants that desire to make voluntary and confidential contributions.

Services will not be denied to anyone unable or unwilling to make a contribution.

CONSULTATION and ASSISTANCE: This includes such client assistance activities as case assistance, HIICAP, help with public benefit applications, etc. The suggested level of contribution is \$5.00 per office visit (Actual cost \$20.00/hour).

IN-HOME SERVICES: This is discussed with the client by the case manager at the time of assessment. The suggested level of contribution is \$3.00 per hour (Actual cost \$21.56/hour).

LEGAL SERVICES: The suggested level of contribution is \$10.00 per attorney consultation (*Actual cost \$149.00/hour*).

NUTRITION:

Senior Congregate Meal or Home Delivered Meals:

The suggested level of contribution is \$4.00 (Actual cost \$15.00/meal).

Nutrition Counseling

Clients requesting diet counseling from the Registered Dietitian are provided with an opportunity to contribute. The suggested level of contribution is \$5.00. (Actual cost \$65.00/hour).

TRANSPORTATION:

Shopping Bus

The suggested level of contribution is \$3.00 round trip (Actual cost \$15.08/one way).

• Senior Center Transportation

The suggested contribution is \$1.00 for round trip (Actual cost: \$7.34/one way).

Medical (Homebound) Transportation

All tolls are to be paid directly by the passenger. The suggested contribution for this service is a sliding scale based on mileage

0-10 miles \$3.00 round trip

11 - 20 miles \$5.00 round trip

21 - 40 miles \$9.00 round trip

41+ miles \$15.00 round trip

(Actual cost is \$29.62 one-way trip, maximum mileage)



ATTENTION GREENE COUNTY TAXPAYERS

Following the unveiling of Governor Hochul's budget proposal to halt the longstanding practice of sharing federal Medicaid funds (eFMAP), the New York State Association of Counties decided to assist county legislatures and residents in opposing this proposal.

The SFY 2024 State Budget proposal would end the Affordable Care Act (ACA) enhanced Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (eFMAP) federal pass-thru to counties. The State is proposing to keep all of these federal savings going forward and use them to cover further expansions of Medicaid eligibility and benefits and to increase payments to health care providers. The elimination of this ACA eFMAP federal pass-thru will require NYS counties to spend at least \$280 million more in SFY 2024, and approximately \$1 billion when New York City is included. The SFY 2024 costs to counties are scheduled to grow by 30 percent by SFY 2027.

It is the strong view of NYSAC that congress intended these federal savings to be shared with counties proportional to the amount they contributed toward the nonfederal Medicaid match. Since 2003, the state has shared the funds proportionally based on an analysis of savings received during periods when an enhanced federal Medicaid match was enacted by Congress. When enacted in 2011, the Medicaid statutory cap was \$7.6 billion. Starting in SFY 2014, New York began sharing these federal ACA savings directly with counties. The savings for a year were provided by lowering the weekly payments each county make to the state to support the State's Medicaid program. Through February 1, 2023, the state continues to share the federal savings with the counties.

NYS Counties strongly disagree with the need to cut county funding so deeply when the Governor's budget proposes to fully fund its own reserves two years ahead of schedule depositing \$5.4 billion into reserves before the end of SFY 2023, while also projecting a general fund surplus of \$35 billion by the end of SFY 2024. The New York State Association of Counties calls on the State to continue to share these federal funds with counties as has been the precedent for over 20 years. Dear Governor Hochul:

As a tax-paying resident of Greene County, I am writing to oppose your Executive Budget proposal to stop sharing the Affordable Care Act (ACA) enhanced Federal Medical Assistance Program (eFMAP) with counties. This proposal would end the 20-year precedent of sharing federal Medicaid savings with local governments that contribute to the Medicaid program.

New York State is proposing to permanently keep all of these federal savings and use them to cover overspending in the Medicaid program because the state has failed to control costs and continues to expand the program. Due to the failure of the state to contain out of control Medicaid costs, it has turned to shifting billions of dollars in new costs onto the backs of local taxpayers. The elimination of this ACA eFMAP federal pass-thru will require counties outside of New York City to spend at least \$280 million more in SFY 2024, and up to \$900 million when New York City is included. The SFY 2024 costs are scheduled to grow by 30 percent by SFY 2027. As a former county official yourself, you can appreciate that this new cost shift by the state will eventually come out of the residents' pockets in the form increased taxes or cuts to services.

Greene County has worked hard to battle the COVID-19 and opioid pandemics, and we continue to deliver, and partially fund, countless human services to the New Yorkers in need in our community.

We share your goal to make New York and our communities more affordable, but this proposal will force us to pass these costs on to our local taxpayers, and that will make that goal more difficult to achieve.

We urge you to reconsider this administrative cost-shift to our property taxpayers and renters, and we encourage you to reverse your proposal.
