There are qualifications for some of our programs. Aging services users have the right to make confidential contributions to the costs of the service so that programs may be expanded. No one shall be denied services due to the inability or unwillingness to make a contribution. (There may be a sliding fee for any in-home services.)

GREENE COUNTY SENIOR SERVICE CENTERS

Each site serves the noon-time menu item for the day, Monday - Friday, for a suggested contribution of \$4.00. All meals include: Meat/Alternative Entrée, Vegetables & Fruit, Bread, Milk & Dessert. Menu is subject to change based on product availability and circumstance. Centers are closed on legal holidays and inclement weather.

If you wish lunch from any of the nutrition sites, you must notify the appropriate center by noon, a day in advance. We also ask if you have signed up and become unable to show, please call us as soon as you can to cancel. This helps to reduce our food waste.

If you would like lunch at either Athens or Catskill & need transportation, please call the Nutrition office to schedule.

Carbohydrate vegetables (AKA starchy vegetables) include potatoes (both sweet and white), yams, pumpkin, corn, peas, beans & legumes, and winter squashes such as acorn and butternut. There always seems to be confusion amongst white vs. sweet potatoes, the benefits, nutrient differences, and which one we should choose most often.

Calorically, a serving of each potato is the same. If you are watching calories and nondiabetic, enjoy white potatoes and sweet potatoes in moderation.

There is a rating system for carbohydrate foods called the "Glycemic Index" (GI) which ranks the food on a scale of 1-100 based on how much the food raises blood glucose. We all know carbohydrates raise our blood glucose. When a carbohydrate is paired with fiber or protein, blood sugar rises gradually, as opposed to spiking. Although the carb—content of each potato is similar, sweet potatoes are lower on the GI than white potatoes because they contain more fiber per serving. When looking to better control blood glucose, choosing a serving of sweet potato over white potato would be recommended.

The nutritional profile of each is quite similar with the exception of potassium, Vitamin A, and beta-carotene (yellow orange pigment in plants which gives them their color). The potassium content of white potatoes is nearly double what a sweet potato

contains. If you need to watch your potassium intake for any reason, choosing a serving of sweet potato would be 200 mg less. Beta carotene is the rich orange color of sweet potatoes, which our body converts to vitamin A supporting eye health. It is also an antioxidant.

acceptable choice for the carbohydrate portion of your meal. Overall, sweet potatoes have more nutritional value. Swapping out white potatoes for sweet potatoes the nutrient content of your plate - just watch the portion size. If you are diabetic, sweet potatoes are the healthier choice to control blood sugar. A carb vegetable serving is about ½ cup.



a beautiful song to you.


Live animals require a lot of special attention and care. Animatronic pets offer you all of the benefits, without all of the special needs involved.



Homebound Medical Transportation Service is available through the Department to county residents, age 60 and older, that do not have other options for needed transportation. The program will arrange for a volunteer driver to transport seniors to medical appointments and to special entitlement agencies.

GREENE COUNTY DEPARTMENT of HUMAN SERVICES CONTRIBUTIONS POLICY



For services under the Older Americans Act and in Community Services for the Elderly which propose contributions, such contributions must be used for costs allowable under applicable regulations and incurred during the budget period that contributions were received. The suggested contributions will not be more than the actual cost of the service. The purpose is to offer participants the opportunity to contribute and to increase the units of services,

particularly to those in greatest need. Envelopes are provided to participants that desire to make voluntary and confidential contributions. Remember to make checks payable to Greene County Department of Human Services & note in memo the service. Services will not be denied to anyone unable or unwilling to make a contribution.

CONSULTATION and ASSISTANCE: This includes such client assistance activities as case assistance, Health Insurance Information Counseling and Assistance Program (HIICAP), help with public benefit applications, etc. The suggested level is \$5.00 per office visit (Actual cost \$20.00/hour).

IN-HOME SERVICES: This is discussed with the client by the case manager at the time of assessment. The suggested level of contribution is \$3.00 per hour (*Actual cost \$21.56/hour*).

LEGAL SERVICES: The suggested level of contribution is \$10.00 per attorney consultation (*Actual cost \$149.00/hr.*).

NUTRITION:

Senior Congregate Meal or Home Delivered Meals: The suggested level of contribution is \$4.00 (Actual cost \$15.00/meal).

Nutrition Counseling: Clients requesting diet counseling from the Registered Dietitian are provided with an opportunity to contribute. The suggested level of contribution is \$5.00. (Actual cost \$65.00/hour).

Health Promotions: There is no suggested contribution for this service. Donations always accepted.

TRANSPORTATION:

Shopping Bus: The suggested level of contribution is \$3.00 round trip (Actual cost \$15.08/one way).

Senior Center Transportation: The suggested contribution is \$1.00 for round trip (Actual cost: \$7.34/one way).

Medical (Homebound) Transportation: The suggested contribution for this service is a sliding scale based on mileage

0 – 10 miles \$3.00 round trip 11 – 20 miles \$5.00 round trip 21 – 40 miles \$9.00 round trip 41+ miles \$15.00 round trip

(Actual cost is \$29.62 one-way trip, maximum mileage)







Look for the YELLOW DOT



Yellow Dot is a life-saving program, started in Connecticut in 2002, which has spread across the country. The New York State Sheriffs' Association is working to make the Yellow Dot program available to help all New York citizens and First Responders.

Over 2 million Yellow Dot kits have been distributed in New York State and we want you to know the meaning if you see one.

Yellow Dot is a free program designed to help First Responders provide life-saving medical attention during that first "golden hour" after a crash or other emergency. The **Yellow Dot** kit contains a medical information card and a Yellow Dot decal.

DRIVERS:

- Complete the card.
- Place it in car glove box.
- Place the Yellow Dot decal on the rear driver's side window.



At HOME, participants:

- Place a Yellow Dot decal near the front door.
- Place a completed card in the freezer compartment of the refrigerator.

FIRST RESPONDERS:

At the scene of a vehicle emergency, look for the Yellow Dot on the rear driver's side window and find vital medical information the in glove compartment. Transport the card with the patient to the hospital.



At the scene of an emergency in a home,

look for the Yellow Dot on or near the front door and find vital medical information in the freezer. Transport the card with the patient to the hospital.
