#### TOWN OF CAIRO LOCAL LAW #3 OF 2020 PARKING, STOPPING AND STANDING

#### §1. Application of law.

The provisions of this law shall apply except when it is necessary to stop a vehicle to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device.

#### §2. Parking prohibited at all times.

No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the streets or parts thereof as set by the Town Board of the Town Cairo by resolution from time to time and posted on the Town website and Town Clerk's Office.

#### §3. Handicapped parking.

After establishment by any governmental agency of specially marked parking spaces for handicapped persons in multifamily dwellings, shopping centers and any other locations in the Town of Cairo, no person shall park a motor vehicle in such space unless a handicapped person is either a passenger, driver or occupant of the vehicle and the vehicle contains a designation issued by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, pursuant to § 1203-a of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, or a permit issued by the Town Clerk of the Town of Cairo which shall be displayed as required by the applicable statute. A "multifamily dwelling," for purposes of this law only, shall be defined as a building designated to be occupied as a residence for three or more families.

§4. Parking of commercial vehicles on streets.

#### A. Definitions. As used in this subsection:

#### COMMERCIAL VEHICLES

Vehicles in excess of 23 feet in length or 12,000 pounds in curb weight. For the purpose of this subsection, a "commercial vehicle" shall also include snow plow attachments, trailers, boats, campers, motor homes, recreational vehicles, storage containers, and heavy construction vehicles (such as backhoes, skid steers, excavators).

- B. Parking permitted: the parking of commercial vehicles while said commercial vehicle is engaged in loading or unloading, including pickups and deliveries, at premises located on said street or is being used in connection with construction, maintenance and repairs or emergency service relating to the premises located within said street during the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m.
- C. Parking restriction. No person shall park or store any commercial vehicle on Town streets or highways between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

#### §5. No stopping.

No person shall stop a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts of streets as set by the Town Board of the Town Cairo by resolution from time to time and posted on the Town website and Town Clerk's Office.

#### §6. No standing.

No person shall stand a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts of streets as set by the Town Board of the Town Cairo by resolution from time to time and posted on the Town website and Town Clerk's Office.

#### §7. Parking prohibited certain hours.

No person shall park a vehicle between the hours specified in and set by the Town Board of the Town Cairo by resolution from time to time and posted on the Town website and Town Clerk's Office, of any day, unless otherwise indicated, upon any of the streets or parts of streets as set by such resolution.

#### §8. Time limit parking.

No person shall park a vehicle for longer than the time limit as set by the Town Board of the Town Cairo by resolution from time to time and posted on the Town website and Town Clerk's Office at any time between the hours listed in said resolution of any day, unless otherwise indicated, upon any of the streets or parts of streets as set by said resolution.

#### §9. Loading zones.

The locations as set by the Town Board of the Town Cairo by resolution from time to time and posted on the Town website and Town Clerk's Office are hereby designated as loading zones.

#### §10. Angle parking.

The locations as set by the Town Board of the Town Cairo by resolution from time to time and posted on the Town website and Town Clerk's Office are hereby designated as areas where angle parking is permitted. Signage and/or pavement markings shall be placed in such a manner as to indicate the authorization of angle parking.

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#### TOWN OF CAIRO LOCAL LAW #2 OF 2024 PARKING, STOPPING AND STANDING

#### §1. Application of law.

The provisions of this law shall apply except when it is necessary to stop a vehicle to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device.

- §2. Parking prohibited at all times.
- A. No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the streets or parts thereof as set by the Town Board of the Town Cairo by resolution from time to time and posted on the Town website and Town Clerk's Office.
- B. No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the streets or parts thereof by parking
  - 1. on a sidewalk,
  - 2. in a designated crosswalk,
  - 3. in a designated no parking zone,
  - 4. in a designated fire zone,
  - 5. within 15 (fifteen) feet of a fire hydrant.
  - 6. too far from a curb such that the parked vehicle obstructs traffic, or
  - 7. with the vehicle facing into on-coming traffic.

#### §3. Handicapped parking.

After establishment by any governmental agency of specially marked parking spaces for handicapped persons in multifamily dwellings, shopping centers and any other locations in the Town of Cairo, no person shall park a motor vehicle in such space unless a handicapped person is either a passenger, driver or occupant of the vehicle and the vehicle contains a designation issued by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, pursuant to § 1203-a of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, or a permit issued by the Town Clerk of the Town of Cairo which shall be displayed as required by the applicable statute. A "multifamily dwelling," for purposes of this law only, shall be defined as a building designated to be occupied as a residence for three or more families.

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Vehicles in excess of 23 feet in length or 12,000 pounds in curb weight. For the purpose of this subsection, a "commercial vehicle" shall also include snow plow attachments, trailers, boats, campers, motor homes, recreational vehicles, storage containers, and heavy construction vehicles (such as backhoes, skid steers, excavators).

B. #### §5. No stopping.

No person shall stop a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts of streets as set by the Town Board of the Town Cairo by resolution from time to time and posted on the Town website and Town Clerk's Office.

#### §6. No standing.

No person shall stand a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts of streets as set by the Town Board of the Town Cairo by resolution from time to time and posted on the Town website and Town Clerk's Office.

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#### §9. Loading zones.

The locations as set by the Town Board of the Town Cairo by resolution from time to time and posted on the Town website and Town Clerk's Office are hereby designated as loading zones.

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The locations as set by the Town Board of the Town Cairo by resolution from time to time and posted on the Town website and Town Clerk's Office are hereby designated as areas where angle parking is permitted. Signage and/or pavement markings shall be placed in such a manner as to indicate the authorization of angle parking.

#### §11. Enforcement

Any violation of this Law shall be subject to the same enforcement requirements provided for in the NYS Vehicle and Traffic Law by any police agency within the State of New York.

#### §12. Repealler

Any prior local laws affecting parking within the Town of Cairo including but not limited to Local Law #3 of 2020 are hereby repealed and superseded by the terms of this local law.

#### §13. Severability

The invalidity or unenforceability of any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision, or phrase of the aforementioned sections, as declared by the valid judgment of any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision, or phrase, which shall remain in full force and effect.

#### §14. Miscellaneous

A. This Local Law is expressly adopted pursuant to the relevant sections of the New York State Town Law and the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

B. This local law shall be effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
